The Day *We look for that peaceable kingdom, where the wolf shall dwell with the lamb, as we hear in the prophecy of Isaiah today. We desire to live in harmony, in accord with Christ Jesus, as our second lesson in Romans calls to us. When we combine the message of our readings today, we discover that in order to have this peace, there must first be righteousness. The Lord's peace is not simply an absence of conflict, or a temporary truce. It is a new reconciliation of relationship, ushered in through the Lord in His righteousness, mercy, divine judgment, and grace.*

as the waters cover the sea.



8 For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, 9 and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

Matthew 3:1-12

P The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Matthew the 3rd chapter beginning at the 1st verse.

to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. 9 And do not presume to say to yourselves, ‘We have Abraham as our father,’ for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. 10 Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

11 “I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 12 His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.”
